### ALUMNI SONS AND DAUGHTERS (70)

### EDUCATIONAL BACKGROUND

The Class of 2019 includes 380 (32%) from college and post-high school preparatory programs which include:

- ♦ 219 from Naval Academy Prep School in Newport, RI
- ♦ 59 from the U.S. Naval Academy Foundation Program civilian preparatory programs
- ♦ 102 additional students have completed at least one semester of study at a college or university and one at a post-secondary prep school.
