ALUMNI SONS AND DAUGHTERS

The Class of 2013 includes 50 sons and 16 daughters of Naval Academy Alumni (5%).

EDUCATIONAL BACKGROUND

The Class of 2013 includes 28% (348) from college and post high school preparatory programs, which include:

- 242 from Naval Academy Preparatory School (NAPS) in Newport, R.I.
- 7 from Nuclear Power School
- 64 from the U.S. Naval Academy Foundation Program (40 from preparatory schools and 24 from other colleges under Foundation Scholarship).
- 35 additional students have completed at least six months of study at a college or university.
